

Weekly Update: May 23 - 27, 2022

Irrigation: We have received about 1.75 inches this week in rainfall. This has been a huge help to the turf. Please remember to still make sure that your rain sensors are on and working properly. Also posted to NABR Network is our Irrigation Suggestions. Finally, irrigation is a supplement to the rain we get, it is not a substitute for it. If we enter a period again of no rain this summer the turf will become stressed and overwatering could lead to another water shortage.

Maintenance:

- Next week we will be edging the Concrete.
- With the 1.75 inches of rain this week we are slightly behind schedule. If your street is not completed you will be the mowed first before we restart the cycle.

Pruning:

- We will begin pruning the site the next week. We will start at the Lodge then begin working on the homes starting at Carter Ct.
- We will be focusing on the evergreen shrubs (i.e., hollies, boxwoods, Loropetalum, Clereya). We will spot pruning the flowering shrubs like Spirea and Abelia for tall shoots, they are not trimmed for shape during the growing season. Roses we will not be prune this time of year.
- If you have a red magnet, we will not be pruning your home.
