Maintenance:

- o This week we will be edging the Beds.
- We completed 90% of the mow for the community by this past Friday, May 6. The rest was finished on this past Saturday.

Pine Straw:

 We will be following the pine straw application in the order that it was laid to spray out any weeds that have sprout ed back up. The weeds will take about a week to die off.

Turf Retreatment:

O I have been monitoring the community for effective treatment. Some areas are requiring a retreatment and I will give the effect areas a 24hour notice before the retreatment. The retreatment is being scheduled out for late this week. We will have signage down to show that an area has been treated. Please, keep you pets off those areas for 24 hrs.



Pest Update:

- Lacewing bugs I have found these bugs on a few homeowners Azaleas. These are not isolated to one section of the community. They can be found on the underside of leaves, and they cause the leaves to brown out and develop holes. Lacewings are easy to treat with an insecticide like Seven Dust. Above are a couple of products that help in control of Lacewings:
- o As with all chemicals: Please read the labels before use!
