

Weekly Update: July 9, 2022

Maintenance:

- Next week 7/11 – 7/15. We will be raising our mower decks to 4.5 inches. We will be mowing through the community on our Normal Schedule. If you do not want us to mow, please leave out the white “no service” flags.
- The above plan is based on Rain coming in this weekend. We will readjust the schedule if Southern Springs receives no rain.
- We will edge the beds next week.

Pruning:

- We will continue pruning on the Parkways and COS areas.
- If you have a red magnet, we will not be pruning your home.

Irrigation:

- Thank you to all the residents that have turned in broken heads on NABR network. That helps maintain the effectiveness of the Irrigation System.
- As a reminder, please do not adjust the COS irrigation systems. As stated last week, we have some areas of the system on City water and some areas on Lake water. A small change to the system can result in damages.

Fall Army Worms: **NO ARMY WORMS HAVE BEEN SEEN THIS YEAR!**

- August of last year we had the Fall Army worms showed up in the community. It does not mean that they will show up again this year.
- Army Worms is a type of cutworm, that come by the hundreds. You may see a cutworm, but that does not make it an Army Worm. (We can help with identification)
- If you feel that you want to treat for Army Worms. A granular insecticide will help build a layer of protection for your turf. **Please Read the Label before use!**
