

Update: Week of June 13, 2022

Maintenance:

- Next week we will be edging the Concrete.

Pruning:

- We have completed the following streets: Pickett Pl, Clay Ct., Clay Pl, Tipton Pass, Overton Way (east), Shelby Springs, Franklin Springs, Coffee Ridge and Davidson Walk.
- We will be continue pruning on Humphrey's Glen on Monday June 13th.
- We will be focusing on the evergreen shrubs (i.e., hollies, boxwoods, Loropetalum, Clereya). We will spot pruning the flowering shrubs like Spirea and Abelia for tall shoots, they are not trimmed for shape during the growing season. Roses we will not be prune this time of year.
- If you have a red magnet, we will not be pruning your home.

Turf Application:

- The 3rd Turf Application is being scheduled out for June 20th. This application will be a post emergent spray for the community. I will have the schedule in next weeks Weekly Update.

Irrigation:

- Moving into the summer months, High Heat and Humidity arrive here in TN. Please remember that these conditions along with high water usage during the morning hours leads to turf diseases. Below are some products that can help with treating turf diseases.

- The spray is more of a spot treatment and the granular is a preventive treatment that works long term in the soil.

All schedules provided are weather permitting. The rotation will shift days but remain in the same order.
