

Weekly Update: June 20th – June 24th, 2022

Maintenance:

- Next week 6/27 – 7/1. I have spoken with the GAC, and together we have decided that with the higher temperatures next week that we will not be mowing next week. Brightview will still be onsite pruning, working on detailing beds, and mowing the Bush Hog areas.

Pruning:

- This week we completed the following streets: Humphrey's Glen, Grainger Springs, Cannon Ln, Fayette Ct, Gibson Tr, Franklin Springs, Madison Ln, Lawrence Ridge, Henderson and Grundy Walk.
- We will start on Overton Way West on Monday 6/28.
- We will be focusing on the evergreen shrubs (i.e., hollies, boxwoods, Loropetalum, Clereya). We will spot pruning the flowering shrubs like Spirea and Abelia for tall shoots, they are not trimmed for shape during the growing season. Roses we will not be prune this time of year.
- If you have a red magnet, we will not be pruning your home.

Irrigation:

- Irrigation is not a substitute for rainfall. Fescue turf grass will go dormant the hotter the temperatures get. Irrigation will help to the fescue

Turf Application:

- 3rd Turf application has been completed.
- This application was a spot spray for turf weeds. This means that the pray techs were looking for the individual weeds and spraying them, rather than performing a blanket application.
- I will be checking the community next week to see how effective the treatment has been.

All schedules provided are weather permitting. The rotation will shift days but remain in the same order. All questions, concerns, and work requests related to landscaping and irrigation must be submitted through the NABR Network website. Ross Broadway, Account Manager, and Brian Lowe, Branch Manager, will review and respond accordingly.
